



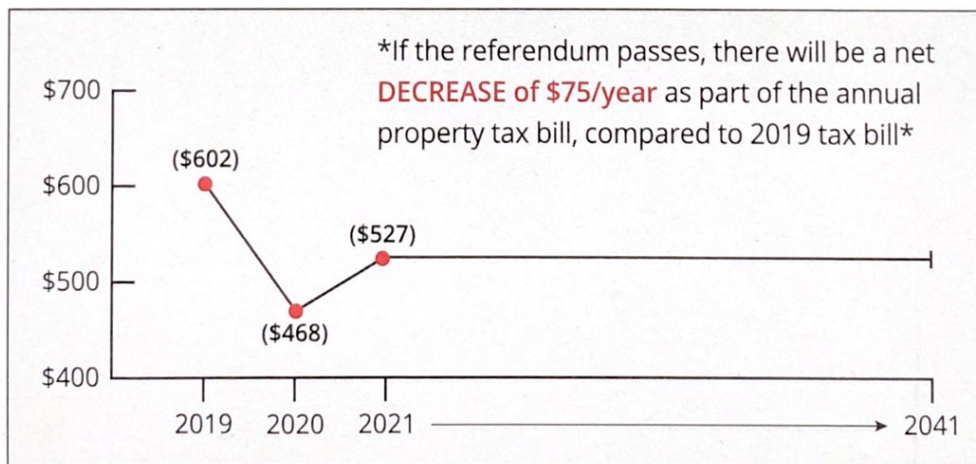
Tax Impact

The following numbers apply to the owner of a \$500,000 home:

- **2019:** Homeowner pays approximately \$602 as part of annual property tax bill, for existing school district referendum debt
- **2020:** Homeowner pays a reduced amount of approximately \$468 as part of annual property tax bill, due to retiring debt

IF \$147 MILLION REFERENDUM PASSES:

- **2021-2041:** Homeowner pays approximately \$527/year as part of annual property tax bill





At a special Board meeting on August 15, Board members approved placing a \$147 million school district referendum question on the March 17, 2020 primary election ballot.

A successful referendum would:

- Improve safety and security at all Barrington 220 schools
- Eliminate mobile classrooms at BMS-Prairie, BMS-Station and Grove Elementary
- Repair and renovate aging building conditions at all schools, such as heating, air conditioning, electrical, plumbing and roofs
- Improve traffic circulation at pick-up/drop-off zones at BHS
- Build PE/Wellness addition at BHS
- Build addition at BHS, which would include:
 - New Student Services area (counseling, attendance, health services, dean's office), so students can easily access these services in one central location
 - Additional classroom space and cafeteria improvements
- Build additional classroom space at middle schools
- Build additional classroom space at all elementary schools to be used for:
 - STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) instruction
 - Students with special needs
- Create architectural design work for Barrington High School Fine Arts Center*

**If voters approve the March 2020 referendum, the Board has committed to engaging the community in a collaborative discussion, for future consideration of a Fine Arts Center at BHS.*
